#### 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 This report deals with the elections held on Thursday 3 May 2007. Details of the results and of the candidates elected are given together with other related information.
- 1.2 These elections were held for all of the Council seats. Three in each of the 9 wards. This followed approval given by the Secretary of State to *The Borough of Eastbourne (Whole Council Elections) Order 2006*. The Order changed the Council's electoral arrangements. Elections by thirds was replaced by whole council elections. The next borough elections will be held in 2011 with the county council elections in 2009.
- 1.3 A total of 89 candidates stood for election representing 5 political parties (Conservative, Green, Labour, Liberal Democrats and UKIP). Only the Liberal Democrats and Conservatives fielded candidates in respect of all 27 vacancies, although all parties except UKIP had candidates in all 9 wards.

#### 2.0 Results

- 2.1 A copy of the election results for the 9 Eastbourne wards is attached at **Appendix 1.**
- 2.2 The candidates elected and their terms of office (see note below) are as follows:-

**Term of office.** The term of office for all of the above named Councillors will expire on the 4<sup>th</sup> day after the ordinary day of election (i.e. the first Thursday in May) in the year 2011.

2.3 The share of the vote across the whole town for each of the parties was as follows:

Conservatives	39.86%
Green	6.58%
Labour	4.69%
Liberal Democrats	46.25%
UKIP	2.61%

(Note: Figures rounded to 2 decimal places. Where 2 or more candidates stood for the same party in a ward an average of the votes for those candidates was used in calculating the share of the overall vote)

#### 3.0 <u>Electoral Turnout Figures</u>

3.1 The total local electorate was 70,566. Overall, the electoral turnout was 42.26%. Turnout by ward is shown in the appendix to this report. This ranged from 31.99% in Hampden Park to 54.76% in Old Town. Previous year's turnout figures (by ward) going back to 2002 are available on request.

#### 4.0 Poll Cards

5.1 Poll cards were again printed in a larger format with additional information advising how to apply for a postal vote. The poll cards were despatched about 5 weeks prior to election day. In addition, poll cards were sent to all postal voters for the first time under new rules designed to improve postal vote security.

### 5.0 Absent Voting

- 5.1 The significant upward trend in the numbers of people applying for postal votes in recent years has abated. The total has once again fallen a little but still remains above 12,000. Postal voters now comprise just over 17% of the total electorate. Of all the votes counted 33.2% were received from postal voters.
- This year, across the country, the government implemented new regulations governing postal voting to improve security. All postal voters' signatures and dates of birth are now held on computer from information provided when application is made. The voting procedure now requires postal voters to sign and give their date of birth when returning their vote. This requires signature recognition software to be linked to our electoral computer system. The whole process is very time consuming but we successfully achieved our objective in checking all returned postal votes.
- 5.3 The following table shows trends in postal voting in local elections since 2000:

(Note: Due to the change in procedures the reasons for rejection have changed).

- 5.4 The total number of replacement postal voting ballot papers issued was 43. These were provided to people who had either not received their papers or had lost them (36 in total) or had spoilt them and needed replacements (7 in total). Proof of identity with photograph is generally required in these cases. The numbers of postal votes received after the close of poll and too late to be counted is 105 at the time of writing (10 May).
- 5.5 A total of 48 proxy votes were granted including, for the first time, one emergency proxy dealt with on the day of poll. This compared with 53 in 2006, 171 in 2005, 123 in 2004, 87 in 2003 and 204 in 2002.

#### 6.0 **Polling Stations**

6.1 31 polling stations were opened between the hours of 7.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m. on the 3 May at 28 different venues. A total of 109 people were employed for the day to staff the stations.

### 7.0 <u>Counting Arrangements</u>

- 7.1 The count took place at the Floral Hall of the Winter Gardens. 114 counting staff were engaged for the purposes of counting the votes. The count commenced at 10.00 p.m. on the 3 May. Other Council staff assisted, including Local Democracy staff, Town Hall reception and support staff, theatres, press office, IT and Steria staff and the members of the Council's Corporate Management Team.
- 7.2 The initial verification stages were completed by about 11.30pm. At this stage the numbers of ballots in the boxes are reconciled with the numbers issued in polling stations and at the opening of the postal votes. The first result was declared at 1.15am (Devonshire Ward) and the last at 2.40am (Upperton).
- 7.3 The Council's website was updated directly from the counting hall and the results displayed on the website shortly after each result was declared.

#### 8.0 <u>De-briefing</u>

8.1 As is now the usual practice, party election agents will be invited to a de-brief meeting with the objective of improving upon the arrangements for future years. This will take place on 7 June 2007. It would be helpful if any Members who wish to raise any issues or make suggestions for the future could draw these to my attention or raise them direct with their party agent.

#### 9.0 <u>Conclusion</u>

9.1 In conclusion I would like to thank all the Council's staff and in particular the Local Democracy team for their efforts in the arrangements and successful conduct of the election process. I would also wish to thank the Party Agents for their co-operation and understanding.
