Recommendations:	Cabinet is recommended to endorse the draft Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy 2002 to 2005.
1.0	<u>Introduction</u>
1.1	The Eastbourne Crime Reduction Partnership was formed in 1998 in response to the Crime and Disorder Act, which gave the Council, the Police and other key partners, new responsibilities for the prevention of crime and disorder. The aim of the partnership is to "reduce crime, disorder and the fear of crime in Eastbourne".

1.2	The first Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy was produced after a period of audit and consultation, which identified priorities for crime and disorder reduction in Eastbourne. The strategy covered the period 1999 to 2002.
1.3	Home Office Guidance states the Partnership must conduct an audit of crime and disorder every three years in order to produce a revised strategy in line with Government crime reduction targets and community concerns. The strategy, which will cover the period 2002 to 2005, builds upon the work already undertaken by the partnership over the last three years.
1.4	The process for devising a crime and disorder reduction strategy involves wide consultation with the community and analysis of information from many organisations in order to determine both crime reduction priorities and geographic areas, which need to be targeted.
2.0	Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy 2002 to 2005
2.1	Two version of the strategy have been prepared, a complete document for statutory and voluntary agencies and a shortened version designed for distribution to members of the public which contains advice and information. The two documents have already been circulated to all Members of the Council and the local press. Further copies are available from Justine Armstrong (contact details given above).
2.2	The draft strategy will be reviewed and amended following consultation. The final strategy will be published on the 1 st April 2002.

	ii) Presentations were made to the Hampden Park Tenants and Residents Associations and the North Langney Forum
	iii) A report was submitted to the Tenants Advisory Committee
	iv) The draft strategy and response form was sent to all 80 members of the Police Consultative Forum. A presentation on the draft strategy was made to the forum.
	v) The draft strategy and response form was sent to 99 statutory organisations and voluntary agencies
	vi)The strategy and questionnaire have been placed on Eastbourne Borough Council Website
4.0	Financial Implications
4.1	East Downs Division, East Sussex County Council and Eastbourne Borough Council have each contributed £2,000 to the preparation and production of the strategy.
5.0	<u>Summary</u>

5.1	The Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy will cover the period 2002 to 2005. It has been prepared following consultation on community concerns and analysis of information on crime trends from a number of organisations and agencies. Six priority areas have been established. Targets for shared best value performance indicators will be taken each year from the Sussex Policing Plan. The strategy will be published on 1st April following consultation on the draft strategy.
