Purpose:	To seek Members approval to amend the Byelaws relating to Promenades and the Byelaws relating to Public Walks and Pleasure Grounds.

Recommendations:	That the Council formally resolve to adopt the byelaws.		
1.0	Background		
1.1	The Council made new general byelaws for the seafront gardens and promenades in 1995.		
1.2	On 29 th September 1997 Environment Committee considered a report on a proposal to extend application of these byelaws to Sovereign Park and the Eastern Parade.		
1.3	A section of the promenade adjacent to the Wastewater Treatment Works is on land that is not owned by the Council and this led to difficulties in the amendments proposed in the report of 29 th September 1997 receiving formal approval from the Home Office.		

1.4	These difficulties have finally been resolved and an Application for the Confirmation of Byelaws ("Promenade Byelaws" and "Pleasure Grounds Byelaws") has now been submitted to the Department for Transport, Local Government and the Regions (DTLR) under their Fast Track Scheme.
1.5	DTLR has indicated that, subject to the consideration of any objections to the proposed amendments, both the "Promenade Byelaws" and the "Pleasure Grounds Byelaws" will be confirmed if they are formally adopted by the Council.
2.0	Amended Byelaws
2.1	The complete text of the proposed amendments to the byelaws is attached as Appendices 1A and 1B.
2.2	Amending these byelaws to include the additional areas detailed in Appendices 1A and 1B will ensure that there is a consistent set of byelaws covering all seafront promenades and pleasure grounds.
2.3	The proposed amendment concerning the definition of model aircraft is required by DTLR as this is consistent with a requirement contained within "Model Byelaws" used by the DTLR as a standard.
3.0	Consultations
3.1	Consultation required by the law was carried out before the general byelaws were made in 1995.
3.2	Southern Water Services, who own the land that the promenade adjacent to the Wastewater Treatment Works sits upon, have been consulted and have confirmed that they have no objection to the proposals.
3.3	The British Model Flying Association has been consulted and has no objection to the proposed byelaws.
I .	

3.4	Further consultation is required through public advertisement when the Council has agreed to amend the byelaws which are required to be formally sealed. Any representations received following advertisement are referred to DTLR, prior to confirmation of the byelaws by DTLR.
4.0	Human Resource and Financial Implications
4.1	The Parades Inspector will normally undertake enforcement of these byelaws. Last Summer an additional budget allocation was approved to employ additional seafront attendants to assist the Parades Inspector in enforcing the byelaws.
4.2	Following confirmation of Byelaws by DTLR and prior to their application additional signage will be required advising of the Byelaws. The costs for signage will be met from existing budgets.
5.0	Environmental, Youth and Anti-Poverty Implications
5.1	There are no significant environmental and youth implications that arise from this report. There are no anti-poverty issues arising from this report.
6.0	Summary
6.1	The byelaws are required to assist in meeting the Council's Corporate Aims of making Eastbourne a safe place, a place to enjoy and a place for everyone. In particular they assist in reducing the fear of crime and ensuring quality places for relaxation and play.
6.2	The amendments to the existing byelaws are required in order to ensure a consistent approach in application of the byelaws to all areas of promenade and seafront pleasure grounds from Holywell through to Langney Point.
