Purpose:	To put forward proposals for the 2003 events programme.

Recommendations:	That the events programme as set out in this report be approved subject to funding from partners.		
1.0	Introduction		
1.1	The function of the Events Development team is to co-ordinate and manage the Council's events programme and to assist others with the safe and professional staging of events.		
1.2	The range and diversity of events is a key marketing tool for attracting new visitors and encouraging repeat business with a view to maximising visitor spend within the borough. The events programme is also recognised as offering a high standard of entertainment to local people, with the Council's events team being recognised nationally as exceptional.		

The current event strategy is to develop events of regional and national status, which have the potential to attract staying visitors to Eastbourne.
The current events programme attracts over 600,000 visitors annually and generates daily visitor and accommodation spend of approximately £4 million.
Planning
Major events require preliminary work at least 12 months in advance. The lead time has increased in recent years to cope with higher standards of public safety involving complex risk assessments, event safety plans, licence and insurance requirements together with consultations and meetings with the emergency services and highways authority.
Large-scale amateur events are no longer possible independent of the council and the organising body must have the professional expertise and the necessary funding to manage and promote the event. If events are proposed on any council facility the events team require a full risk assessment, insurance and other legislative information as appropriate in order to protect the Council's interests and avoid any potential liability.
For the above reasons it is necessary to present the proposed events programme in advance of the 2003 Council budget.
2003 Programme
The list of established events is attached as Appendix "A" together with the provisional dates for 2003. These are events, which actively involve the Events Development Team.

3.2	There are other events organised independently by different groups in Eastbourne. The provisional list of all events for 2003 is attached as Appendix "B".
4.0	<u>New Developments</u>
4.1	A number of new initiatives have been investigated for 2003. These have been filtered to match the limited resources, the current event dates and the likely public interest. These also build on the work undertaken in 2002 in managing and re - branding of established events.
4.2	Beachy Head Marathon – 25 th October 2003
	The Council took over the management and delivery of this event in February 2002. The event will take place in 2002 on 26 th October and will attract around 1300 participants. Discussions are taking place with a number of major charities with a view to them co-ordinating and benefiting from this event in 2003 No budgetary implications self financing through entry fees and sponsorship
4.3	Eastbourne Buses 100 years Bus Rally -13 th July 2003
	Next year marks the 100 th anniversary of Eastbourne Buses as the "oldest municipal bus service in the world ". The events development team is working with Eastbourne Buses and the Eastbourne Omnibus Society on the plans for an event that will mark this occasion this will include a bus rally and associated displays. The event will take place on the seafront. A similar event in 1993 for the 90 th anniversary attracted 15,000 visitors. Costs to be met via private/public partnership and will
	be self-financing.

1.4	999 Emergency Services	
	Display - 2 nd & 3 rd August 2003	
	After a break of one year this popular event will return to the Western Lawns in 2003.The event features displays, exhibits and arena attractions from Sussex Police, East Sussex Fire Brigade, Sussex Ambulance Service, RNLI and HM Coastguard.The 2 day event attracts 30,000 visitors to the seafront.	
	To be met from within 2003 events budget. This event will have significant joint agency support.	
4.5	Town Centre Management Initiative - various events throughout the year	
	Upon the appointment of a new Town Centre Manager this role will be more focussed on the promotion of events that will attract visitors to the Town Centre. The new TCM will work with the Events Development team to stage events building on some of the existing town centre events programme such as French Markets and Christmas Cracker and will develop contacts for street theatre and music performance to produce events that will enhance the town centre shopping experience for residents and visitors.	
	No budgetary implications - self-financing through sponsorship from local business and TCMI partnership.	

4.6	International Tennis
	Championships
	Following the confirmation from Britannic Asset Management of a 3 year sponsorship agreement until 2005 the Events Development team will be working with the Lawn Tennis Association and the sponsor on ideas and initiatives that will improve the content of this well established event and further improve value for money of the ticket to the visitors to the event. Any additional costs to be offset by increased ticket sales.
4.7	Airbourne - Eastbourne's International Airshow
	In 2002 the event celebrated its 10 th anniversary and number of major changes took place to the key personnel on the event. These included the appointment of a new flying display director from the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund.In 2003 the events team will need to continue to establish this partnership and working relationship. In addition work will continue to maintain the event as one of the premier airshows in the country working with the event's principal sponsor csma and attracting secondary sponsors and income streams to the event. This event will be self-financing beyond the initial council resources.
4.8	Picnic in the Park Concert
	The area of Devonshire Park affords itself as a natural amphitheatre with ready accessibility to the infrastructure necessary to hold a two-day concert event. This proposal is in the very early stages of development, however, it is envisaged that one evening would be classical in orientation with the second evening being based around popular music. This event will only take place if it is self-financing.
5.0	Financial Implications

5.1	The rationale for staging events is that they attract more income to the town than the net cost. This is the case for all the existing events (as an example the net cost of Airbourne is £30,550 for a total visitor spend income of more than £3million). However, it is accepted that in the early stages of development some pump priming is often required.
5.2	Income generation through ticket sales, trade and exhibition space and company sponsorships are key to the Events Development budget. For the financial year 2002/2003 the income target is £648,750.00
5.3	It should be borne in mind that the impact upon tourism visitor numbers to the town is often broader than the net cost of any one event. The events increase our appeal and broaden awareness of the borough to many target segments.
6.0	Human Resource Implications
6.1	The budget for any new events have to include the staffing resources needed to stage the event safely and efficiently. The Events Development team is currently operating at the limit on the current programme and there is no spare capacity.
7.0	Youth Implications
7.1	The 2003 Events Programme includes events, which will also appeal to younger people such as the Skate Festival, Airbourne, the Family Festival of Tennis and the 999 Emergency Services Display.
8.0	Environmental Implications

8.1	The budgets always include reinstatement costs to protect the land used for major events. There is close co-operation between the Events Development team and officers in Parks and Gardens, Highways and Cleansing and Environmental Health.
8.2	There is close monitoring of the noise impact of events to minimise inconvenience to local residents. When possible local residents are written to, to keep them informed of any impact of the events programme on their property.
9.0	Conclusion
9.1	The events programme in Eastbourne is already highly successful. The Events Development service will in 2003 deliver either by direct management or through partnerships with local community groups over 30 events.
9.2	In addition the officers will continue to provide a professional advice service to any group or organisation seeking advice on the staging of an event in the resort.
