1.1	The Community Grants for 2003-4 were launched in October 2002. Community and voluntary groups were invited to apply for funds with a closing date of 13 th January 2003. We received 30 applications for funding totalling £133,134. The budget available for allocation is £54,700.

Assessment Criteria

Grant applications are assessed against their ability to deliver activities to match the Corporate Aims and Objectives as follows:

A) A Safe Place:

- A1. To reduce crime and fear of crime in Eastbourne;
- A2. To stifle the supply of drugs within our community;
- A3. To reduce substance misuse and its effects on individuals in the community by helping people to resist substance misuse:
- A4. To protect our community from anti-social behaviour. Promote constructive activity for young people;
- A5. To enable people with substance misuse problems to overcome them and to live healthy crime-free lives;

- A6. To reduce the incidence of criminal damage and therefore the cost to the community;
- A7. To promote a more positive image of young people in Eastbourne by encouraging them to play an active role within the community;
- A8. To encourage more investment in young people;
- A9. To address the needs of young people;
- A10. To reduce the incidents of domestic abuse by making it unacceptable in our community;
- B) A Healthy Place:
- B1. Projects which tackle poverty, poor housing and social exclusion and health inequalities;
- B2. Projects which support health education, awareness and prevention;
- B3. Projects that promote a healthy lifestyle
- C) A Prosperous Place:
- C1. Projects which support the development of lifelong learning;
- C2. Projects which support the transfer of skills and mentoring
- D) A Place to Enjoy:
- D1. Projects which contribute to social inclusion, through audience development;
- D2. Projects which promote and develop Eastbourne's cultural identity, in particular it's unique environment, with work, which inspires and excites;
- D3. Projects which support the visual and musical creativity of adults, new projects that engage young people in the arts and heritage;
- D4 Projects which make cultural and sporting events more physically accessible in the community;
- D5. Projects which encourage Sports Development by providing opportunities for young people and the disabled;
- D6 Projects which encourage older people to take up sporting activities with recognised health benefits.
- D7. Projects which promote the development of community pride and a sense of place or heritage.
- E) A Place for Everyone:
- E1. Projects, which support the provision of advice and guidance services to the community;
- E2. Projects which encourage community participation such as tenants and residents associations;
- E3. Projects which encourage Youth Development by providing opportunities for young people;
- E4 Projects which support Community Development and capacity building;

- E5. Projects with multi-cultural subject matter
- F) A Place for the Future:
- F1. Projects which offer new perspectives on the local environment or explore wider social issues;
- F2. Projects which enhance the environment we live in and promote recycling and conservation.
