1.0	Background / Introduction
1.1	The attached ESCC letter and proposal document (Appendix 1) represents a response to the recently introduced Health & Social Care Act 2002 giving powers to local authorities with Social Services departments to undertake the scrutiny of health and health services within their locality.

1.2	In exercising this power, it is expected that, for two tier authorities, close operational arrangements will be developed with District and Borough Councils.
1.3	Eastbourne Borough Council's Director of Housing, Health & Community Finance has attended two meetings of County and District Officers for the purposes of considering and developing such proposals.
2.0	Detailed Overview and Scrutiny Committee Proposals
2.1	It should be noted from the attached proposal document that key considerations have been the need to comply with health overview and scrutiny regulations as well as provide for co-opted members from Districts and Boroughs with full voting rights.
2.2	In the context of Joint Officer discussions, the following considerations were specifically raised by the Director of Housing, Health & Community Finance:
	 Ø Inability of existing structures to provide necessary representative framework (e.g. Health & Social Care Partnership Board). Ø Need to avoid unwieldy mechanisms and any potential duplication of activity. Ø Extent to which prior consideration of Scrutiny Programme might assist in developing most effective structures and establishing necessary resource requirements. Ø Need for clear understanding of local scrutiny requirements and extent of impact upon existing local structures (e.g. Eastbourne Borough Council Scrutiny Committee, Healthy Eastbourne Board). Ø Scale / cost of proposals and extent to which resource implications have not been considered in context of Eastbourne Borough Council's 2003 / 04
	budget process.

3.0	Consultations
3.1	It is anticipated that results of consultation undertaken to date will be available for Cabinet.
3.2	In particular, such proposals have been discussed with Eastbourne Downs Primary Care Trust and Community Health Councils.
4.0	Human Resource Implications
4.1	In the absence of any draft scrutiny programme, the extent to which local scrutiny requirements will impact upon existing Members and Officer structures is unclear. Areas / structures potentially affected include:

	Ø Healthy Eastbourne Board
	Ø Eastbourne Strategic Partnership
