Thank you for forwarding this to us, I did want to point out though that within our application for a variation to license, at no point do we mention people will 'enjoy the music' in the garden. When yourself and Stuart visited the property months ago and we discussed the proposed work we made it clear that there is not to be music within the structure in the garden area, so there will be no noise nuisance. I believe there has been a misunderstanding of the plans. The removal of waiter/waitress service will not cause noise nuisance, and our structure is able to be opened and closed as we should require.
