25 Minutes.

26 Declarations of Interest.

27 Devolved Budgets Year End 2010/2011.

The committee received a copy of the year end figures for the Devolved Budget Ward Scheme for 2010/2011. Members noted that there had been a total of 57 Schemes across Eastbourne this year with 98.8% of the total budget being spent.

28 Devolved Budgets and Neighbourhood Panels.

29 Neighbourhood Panels.

St Anthonys Ward – Councillor Harris agreed to provide a written response to the Committee following the meeting.

Sovereign – Councillor Salsbury update members on the progress of the Neighbourhood panels in Sovereign namely; Sovereign, Langney Point and Kingsmere/Kings Park. There had recently been a high profile campaign to deal with dog littering which had improved the cleanliness of parks and pathways in and around schools; speeding cars had also been an issue. Councillor Salsbury agreed that there was a good working relationship with the residents and the Police at each of the three Neighbourhood Panels. 352

Upperton – Councillor Marsden updated the committee as follows;

Issues included:

- Speeding traffic in a wide number of roads including: St. Annes Road, The Goffs, Carew Road
- Dog fouling: Gildredge Park, Watts Lane, Upperton/Hartfield Gardens
- Sporadic anti-social behaviour
- Parking Issues

Actions taken to counteract:

- Speed checks had been carried out
- Dog Warden had carried out checks but had limited availability
- Police and community enforcement officers were carrying out regular patrols for parking issues.

Successes within the Neighbourhood Panels:

- There had been a reduction of congestion outside Thomas a Beckett School
- Meeting had been held with controller of parking enforcement company to clarify role of wardens and their duties. Members raised some concerns about discrepancies with parking in certain loading bays 'after hours'.

Feedback from Community:

• Residents welcomed opportunities to report issues and noted the improvements in their areas.

The Chairman reminded Councillors of the importance of using the templates provided for both Devolved Budget and Neighbourhood Panel reports as it would aid the committee in comparing the Council's performance in future years. Templates were available from the Scrutiny Co-ordinator and were circulated to ward members a month prior to the committee meeting they were scheduled to report to.
