Dear Councillor,

In accordance with paragraph 16 of the Scrutiny Procedure Rules contained in the Council's Constitution, Councillor S J Osborne has requested that the draft decision contained in Minute 54.1 of the Cabinet at its meeting on 7 September 2011, be called-in for consideration by the Scrutiny Committee. The draft decision related to the "Review of Lewes Conservation Area Boundary" and the text of Minute 54.1 reads as follows:

"54.1 That the prioritisation of the progression of the boundary changes to Lewes Conservation Area, as recommended in the 2007 Conservation Area Character Appraisal and as detailed in Report No 147/11, be not agreed and that no further action be taken by the Council on the matter".

I am therefore now required to e-mail the reasons for the request of Councillor Osborne to all members of the Scrutiny Committee. The reasons are:

- "1) The work to extend the Lewes Conservation Area would be funded by the South Downs National Park Authority, so the cost implications would be minimal.
- 2) The extension would quite likely have widespread support in Lewes.
- 3) The decision by Cabinet gives the appearance of putting the interests of the County before the interests of the District.
- 4) This extension merits prioritisation over other proposed extensions because the County Council is currently consulting on proposals that would involve a change of use at the site. A delay in implementation might result in a permanent loss of opportunity to protect valuable open space in Lewes".

<u>Members of the Scrutiny Committee</u> must decide within two working days whether they support the request for the draft decision to be reviewed. If you do support the request, then you must e-mail your response to me, zoe.downton@lewes.gov.uk by 5.00pm on Tuesday, 20 September 2011.

A meeting of a Panel of the Committee will be held if at least five members of the Committee are in favour of calling in the draft decision.

As Councillor Osborne is a member of the Scrutiny Committee, her submission of the call-in request constitutes her as being one of the five members of the Committee who are required to be in favour of calling in the draft decision in order that a Panel of that Committee can consider the matter.
