

Minutes of meeting held in Court Room - Town Hall, Eastbourne on 26 September 2019 at 6.00 pm

1 Appointment of Chair

Councillor Vaughan proposed and Councillor Di Cara seconded that Councillor Maxted be appointed as Chair of this meeting.

RESOLVED: That Councillor Robin Maxted was appointed Chair for the meeting.

2 Minutes of the meetings held on 1 April 2019

The minutes of the meetings of the Sub Licensing Committee held on 1 April 2019 were approved and the Chair was authorised to sign them as a correct record.

3 Apologies for absence / declaration of substitute members

None received.

4 Declarations of Disclosable Pecuniary Interests (DPIs) by members as required under Section 31 of the Localism Act and of other interests as required by the Code of Conduct

There were none.

5 Application for the variation of a Sexual Entertainment Venue Licence, Lux, 2a-2b Pevensey Road, Eastbourne, BN21 3HJ

The Chair welcomed everyone. All parties present introduced themselves and the Chair detailed the procedure to be followed and asked if there were any representations to vary it. There were none.

Counsel for the Applicant, Mr James Rankin, declared he would be speaking on behalf of the Applicant, Mr Forte.

The Specialist Advisor presented a report which outlined the application and highlighted relevant policy considerations.

The Chair invited Members and then the Applicant and Mr Rankin, to ask questions of the Specialist Advisor. There were none.

Mr Rankin, Counsel, representing the applicant, addressed the Sub Committee.

Having noted that no objections to the application had been received, Mr Rankin focussed on addressing considerations pertaining to the Council's own Policy.

Points put forward for consideration included:

- That Mr Forte's history of owning the adjacent nightclub demonstrated a well run establishment.
- That the investment in the nightclub had led to an increase of investment and overall improvement to the area
- That the Police traditionally welcomed such establishments, as high levels • of management help to ensure avoidance of public disorder.
- That the variations being requested were in line with national trends and • customer expectations around full nudity and that the Council's policy had become outdated in this area.
- That the current licence conditions had deterred national companies who would otherwise have been interested in operating the premises.
- That the club would be appealing to the same customer profile as • identified in the Council's Tourism Policy (those aged 35+ with disposable income).
- That historically the 1 metre distance rule between dancer and customer had been shown to be difficult to enforce and difficult to evidence. Mr Rankin suggested that nationally, the stipulation now was for 'no physical contact' and further argued that this 'simpler' version was in line with advice from the Home Office and that the current Licence already had this stipulation (Condition 8) in place.

In summary. Mr Rankin said that the request for variations to the Licence brought the conditions in line with current expectations and norms, as outlined earlier.

The Chair invited Members to ask questions of Mr Rankin.

Councillors asked a number of questions and Mr Rankin replied, referring and expanding on the points of argument laid out in his addressing remarks.

Regarding questions about the variation for full nudity, Mr Rankin explained that his client had been unable to open and create a 'track record' because potential operators were not interested if they were unable to meet market

expectation for full nudity. To operate the premises himself, his client would be faced with the same barrier to business success.

Regarding questions about the loss of the 1 metre rule distance rule, Mr Rankin argued that any safeguarding rule needed to be practical and enforceable to have meaning and cited legal best practice and Home Office advice to argue that the 'No Touching' condition was an easier and clearer cut rule to enforce, which was why other Councils had removed this clause. It was still important to remove the 1 metre distance rule as fewer conditions was best practice and it left the potential for a £20k fine. Mr Rankin confirmed that the 'No Touching' rule would be clearly displayed at the entrance and around inside the premises, including on the tables, and also from staff, including door staff and CCTV.

The Chair invited the Applicant and Mr Rankin to make any closing remarks (maximum 2 minutes). Mr Rankin declared they had covered all the points in their earlier address.

The Sub Committee members retired at 6.42pm to consider and determine the application. Michele Wilkinson as Legal Adviser was in attendance to assist with any legal queries.

Having taken into account all the relevant considerations, the Sub Committee returned to the meeting at 7:12pm and announced the decision as follows:

RESOLVED: That the application to vary the licence be approved, as set out in the attached Decision Notice document (Minutes Appendix 1).

Decision of Licensing Sub Committee Hearing, 26 September 2019

Application for the variation of a Sexual Entertainment Venue Licence by F Forte Developments Ltd at LUX , 2a-2b Pevensey Road, Eastbourne, BN21 3HJ.

The hearing concerned the application for a variation of the Sexual Entertainment Venue Licence by F Forte Developments Ltd at LUX, 2a-2b Pevensey Road, Eastbourne, BN21 3HJ.

The applicant applied, amongst other things, (as outlined in full in the Report at para 2.3) to remove the conditions on the licence which related to full nudity not being permitted and the requirement that there be a minimum distance of one meter between the dancer and the seated customers at all times.

In discharging its functions the Sub Committee considered the relevant legislation, the relevant Home Office guidance, the Council's Sex Establishment and Encounter Policy, and the rules of natural justice.

The Sub Committee noted that no objections had been received to the application.

The Sub Committee considered the application and the oral representations made by the applicant's representative, Mr Rankin, at the hearing. Those representations are outlined in the minutes of the hearing.

In its deliberations the Sub Committee considered what decision would be appropriate from the options outlined in paragraph 5.1 of the Report.

Decision

The Sub Committee's decision was to make the variations specified in the application and as set out in paragraph 2.3 of the Report.

Reasons for decision

The Sub Committee accepted the arguments made by the applicant's representative about the potential problems of enforceability in relation to the minimum 1 metre distance between the dancer and the seated customers (current condition 10) and noted that the conditions about no touching (current conditions 8 and 14) would remain. Further the Sub Committee were content with the applicant's arguments made regarding removing the condition which did not allow full nudity (current condition 7).

At the hearing the Chair confirmed that the Sub Committee agreed to make all the variations applied for.

1 Introduction

- 1.1 Eastbourne Borough Council received an application for a major variation to the current Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the Three Monkeys Bar and Kitchen premises at 16 Langney Road, Eastbourne from Dene Sonnessa. The application is included at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 The premises has held a licence since April 2017, under the name of Moreys, the change of name is included as part of this variation application. The premises has not traded as a licensed premises since receiving this licence therefore no DPS was needed to be named on the existing licence, going forward the DPS will be Mr Dene Sonnessa as confirmed in **Appendix 6**. The premises licence had been suspended due to non-payment of the annual fee but this was paid in full in September 2019 so it is a current licence. A copy of the current premises licence is included at **Appendix 2**.

2 The Application

2.1 An application for the grant of a variation to the premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the following:

To add

Films

Monday - Sunday 08:00-03:00

Live music

Monday- Sunday 23:00-03:00

Recorded Music

Monday- Sunday 23:00-03:00

Performances of dance

Monday - Sunday 23:00-03:00

Anything of a similar description

Monday- Sunday 23:00-03:00

This is to cover use of an amplified karaoke machine

To extend

Late night refreshment

Monday -Sunday 23:30-02:30

Supply of alcohol

Monday- Sunday 23:00-02:30 (current licence is until 23:30hrs)

Opening Hours

Monday- Sunday 00:00-03:00

Note: Live and recorded music are deregulated within an on-licensed premises authorised and open for the sale of alcohol from 08:00hrs to 23:00hrs for audiences up to 500. Live unamplified music does not need a licence anywhere and with no audience limit between 08:00hrs to 23:00hrs.

Note: within the application some licensable activities have been crossed through this was done by a Licensing Caseworker with the applicant at the time of the application following a discussion about what he required on the licence.

2.2 The variation application is also asking to alter condition's as follows

To remove:

Waiter service to persons seated at tables

To change:

Substantial food available at all times **to** Substantial food available until 21:00hrs.

A copy of the application has been included at **Appendix 1**.

3 Licensing Objectives

3.1 When submitting an application for a variation to the current premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003, the applicant is required to describe any steps they intend to take to promote the four Licensing Objectives as defined by the Licensing Act 2003. The Operating Schedule detailing these steps can be seen in the application form. This is included at **Appendix 1**.

4 <u>Consultation Process</u>

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires applicants to advertise both on the premises and in a local newspaper in order to inform the public of the application. The application details are also advertised on the council's website. A number of "Responsible Authorities" have also been consulted as part of the process. There was a consultation period of 28 days for representations to be made, the applicant conformed with all the requirements as laid out within the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2 During the consultation process Sussex Police have requested specific conditions to be placed onto the licence if/when it is granted. There is an email trail between Sussex Police and the applicant. A copy of this is included at **Appendix 3.** Sussex Police have also submitted a representation based around the Premises being located within the Cumulative Impact Zone and their concerns that the Premises would not effectively promote the Licensing objectives. A copy of this representation is included at **Appendix 4**.
- 4.3 Eastbourne Borough Councils Noise Pollution team have also submitted a representation asking for conditions to be attached to the licence if/when granted. A copy of this email is included at **Appendix 5**.

5 The Decision Making Process - The Licensing Objectives

5.1 In their decision making, the Licensing Sub-Committee must act to promote the four Licensing Objectives. All carry equal weight as part of the process. The

Licensing Objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

6 Eastbourne Borough Council's Statement of Licensing Policy & Section 182 Guidance Issued

- 6.1 Copies of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy have previously been circulated to Members. A copy is also retained in the Members' Room.
- 6.2 Whilst each application will be considered on its merits, the Licensing Sub-Committee will act to promote the four licensing objectives and have due regard to:
 - Eastbourne Borough Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2019 2024.
 - Section 182 Guidance issued by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport.
- 6.3 Eastbourne Borough Council's Statement of Licensing Policy outlines the matters that the Authority will consider when determining matters under the Licensing Act 2003. An overview appears below.

6.4 <u>The Prevention Of Crime and Disorder</u>

The Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states that the Operating Schedule should include steps to ensure the deterrence and prevention of crime and disorder on and in the vicinity of premises. The restriction of types of licensable activity, hours and imposition of conditions may be considered and applied as appropriate.

6.5 <u>Public Safety</u>

The Statement of Licensing Policy states that the Operating Schedule should include steps to ensure the physical safety of patrons. This might include the imposition of conditions regarding capacity and mechanisms to promote responsible drinking. The restriction of types of licensable activity, hours and imposition of conditions may be considered and applied as appropriate.

6.6 <u>Protection of children from harm</u>

The Statement of Licensing Policy requires that operating plans must specify the measures and management controls in place to protect children from harm. Conditions can be placed to restrict access to children to the premises during certain times or when certain licensable activities are taking place. The restriction of types of licensable activity, hours and imposition of conditions may be considered and applied as appropriate.

6.7 <u>Prevention of Public Nuisance</u>

The Statement of Licensing Policy states that within the Operating Schedule, applicants will be required to demonstrate how they intend to prevent nuisance arising, disturbance occurring and mechanisms to protect amenities. The restriction of types of licensable activity, hours and imposition of conditions may be considered and applied as appropriate.

7 Cumulative Impact

- 7.1 The premises in question are located within the Cumulative Impact Zone. It is recognised that the impact of the number, type and density of licensed premises in a given area may lead to problems of noise, nuisance, crime and disorder outside of, or a distance from licensed premises.
- 7.2 Cumulative Impact is defined as the "potential impact upon the Licensing Objectives of a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in an area," and is a proper matter for consideration by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.3 The Licensing Authority may receive representations from a Responsible Authority or 'Interested Party' (any person) that the cumulative affect of licences is leading to an area becoming saturated. This creates exceptional problems of disorder and nuisance, over and above the impact from individual premises which undermines the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 7.4 Where valid representations are received, the Cumulative Impact Policy creates a rebuttable presumption that the application will be refused.

It is for the applicant to address the Cumulative Impact Policy and produce evidence to demonstrate that the matter:

- (a) Will not add to the cumulative impact caused by licensed premises and challenges already experienced in the area;
- (b) Will not undermine the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 7.5 The Cumulative Impact Policy clearly states that new licence applications and variations to existing licences, in the Zone should be refused, unless Members are satisfied that the applicant has provided evidence to show that premises will not exacerbate existing issues in the locality, or undermine the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 7.6 It is stressed that the presumption to refuse an application does not relieve the Responsible Authority or anyone else making a representation of the need to provide supporting evidence in conjunction with a relevant representation. This must be submitted before the Licensing Authority may lawfully consider the effect of the Cumulative Impact Policy.
- 7.7 The Cumulative Impact Policy can be found within the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2014 2019.

8 **Representations**

- 8.2 The Sub-Committee will need to have regard to any history or likelihood of noise, nuisance, crime and disorder at the site, or in the vicinity of the site. In addition, matters impacting upon public safety and strategies to protect children from harm will also need to be considered.
- 8.3 The Sub-Committee may also consider any other matters that may negatively impact upon the Licensing Objectives and exercise their powers to impose conditions, or take the appropriate action as they see fit, in order to promote the Licensing Objectives.
- 8.4 In determining what, if any, conditions should be attached to a licence, these should only be imposed where it is considered appropriate and proportionate on a case by case basis. The applicant, any person or any Responsible Authorities may also suggest conditions to address concerns as a means to promote the Licensing Objectives. The Sub-Committee may not impose any condition unless its discretion has been exercised following receipt of a relevant representation and is satisfied that it is appropriate to promote one or more of the licensing objectives.

9 Options open to the Sub-Committee

- 9.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee shall take the steps it considers appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objections and may;
 - Modify the conditions of the licence (alter or omit or add new)
 - Reject the whole or part of the variation application
- 9.2 The Sub-Committee are asked to note the procedures relating to this hearing which are contained in The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing) Regulations 2005.

10 Legal Considerations

- 10.1 Under the Licensing Act 2003 section 34 the holder of a premises licence may apply to the Licensing Authority for the variation of the licence. Under section 35 on such an application the Licensing Authority must grant the application unless relevant representations are made in which case a hearing must be held unless the applicant and each person who has made representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The Sub Committee having regard to the representations made shall take such a step as referred to in paragraph 9.1 above as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 10.2 Under Schedule 5 Licensing Act 2003 the applicant may appeal if the Sub Committee rejects, in whole or in part, the application to vary the premises licence or the decision to modify conditions. Further, any person who has made relevant representations may appeal if they contend that any variation ought not to have been made or any conditions modified. Any appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the appellant being notified in writing of the decision.

11 Financial Appraisal

15 Human Rights

- 15.1 The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998, must be borne in mind by the Sub-Committee when taking licensing decisions under the Licensing Act 2003. Particular regard should be had to Article 1 of the First Protocol, which relates to the protection of property and the peaceful enjoyment of possessions and property, and Article 8 which relates to the right to respect for private and family life, home and correspondence should also be borne in mind. While the Human Rights Act makes it unlawful for a local authority to act or to fail to act in a way that is incompatible with a Convention right, Article 1 of the First Protocol and Article 8 are both qualified rights which means that interference to a justifiable extent may be permitted as long as what is done:
 - Has a basis in law;
 - Is intended to pursue a legitimate purpose;
 - Is necessary and proportionate; and
 - Is not discriminatory.

Good afternoon Mr Sonnessa,

Thank you for meeting with me today at Bexhill Police Station to discuss your application.

You informed me that you will be a restaurant during the day up and till 2100hrs allowing all ages in for meals (you advised me you didn't want to be restricted with restaurant conditions). At 2100hrs you want to become late night venue with a lively atmosphere. You want to have DJs, recorded and live music and karaoke. Your audience being aimed at the younger generation (over 18yrs), a bar to visit before heading to Cameo.

Your application has not referred to the Cumulative Impact Zone or the Eastbourne Borough Councils statement of licensing. You have not offered sufficient conditions that would help mitigate any potential risk in a busy part of Eastbourne or provided enough assurances of how the premises will promote the four licensing objectives.

You were asked if you had read the Councils statement of licensing which you confirmed you hadn't. You were not aware of the Cumulative Impact Zone or what it meant but did have little knowledge of the Four Licensing Objectives (mainly that they formed part of the application form) You informed me you had sought advice from a licensing consultant but that was to two and a half years ago. You felt because you obtained the original licence you would be ok to make variations. I explained the difference in the type of licence you currently have to the one you are applying for, a vertical drinking establishment.

Rather than object to the application at this stage I said I would work with you first to see what we could agree to. We discussed conditions that could go on the licence to help support the four licensing objectives. Below are a number of conditions I would like you to consider having on your licence when/if granted. Please review them, make changes where required but clearly highlight those changes so I can easily see them;

CCTV:

- Digital CCTV and appropriate recording equipment to be installed in accordance with Home Office Guidelines relating to UK Police Requirements for Digital CCTV System (current PSDB Publication), operated and maintained throughout the premises internally and externally to cover all public areas, including the entrance to the premises. The system shall be on and recording at all times the premises licence is in operation.
- The CCTV cameras and recording equipment must be of sufficient quality to work in all lighting levels inside the premises at all times.
- CCTV footage will be stored for a minimum of 31 days.
- The management will give full and immediate cooperation and technical assistance to the Police in the event that CCTV footage is required for the prevention and detection of suspected or alleged crime.
- The CCTV images will record and display dates and times, and these times will be checked regularly to ensure their accuracy.
- Subject to GDPR guidance and legislation, the management of the premises will ensure that key staff are fully trained in the operation of the CCTV, and will be able to download selected footage onto a disk (or other electronic portable device acceptable to Sussex Police) for the police without difficulty or delay and without charge to Sussex Police.
- Any breakdown or system failure will be notified to the police immediately & remedied as soon as is practicable.
- In the event of the CCTV system hard drive being seized as evidence as part of a criminal investigation by Sussex Police or for any other reason, the premises will be expected to install a replacement hard drive or a temporary replacement drive as soon as practicable.

Training/Authorisation:

 a) The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all staff members engaged, or to be engaged, in selling alcohol at the premises shall receive the following induction training. This training will take place prior to the selling of such products: *The lawful selling of age restricted products *Refusing the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk

- b) Further verbal reinforcement/refresher training covering the above will be carried out thereafter at intervals not to exceed 3 months, with the date and time of the verbal reinforcement/refresher training documented.
- c) All such training undertaken by staff members shall be fully documented and recorded and signed by both the employee and the DPS. All training records shall be kept on the premises and made available to Sussex Police, officers of the local authority and officers from the Trading Standards team upon request.
- d) A list of staff members who are authorised to sell alcohol on the premises shall be kept. This shall be endorsed by the DPS with the date such authorisation commences.

Challenge 25:

- a) The premises will operate an **age verification** policy set at a minimum of 25 years (e.g. "Challenge 25") whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under the specified age e.g. 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The recommended forms of ID that will be accepted are passports, official Photographic Identity Cards issued by EU states bearing a hologram or ultraviolet feature, driving licences with a photograph, photographic military ID or proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram. The list of recommended forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of Sussex Police, the Licensing Authority and Trading Standards without the need to amend the licence or conditions attaching to it.
- b) Signage advertising the age verification or 'Challenge 25' policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises.

Incident Log:

An incident log will be maintained by the premises showing a detailed note of incidents that occur in the premises. The log will be inspected and signed off by the DPS (or a person with delegated authority) every 4 weeks.

- a) The log book should be kept on the premises and be available for inspection at all times the premises are open by authorised officers of the Licensing Authority or the police. An incident will be defined as being one which involves an allegation of a criminal offence.
- b) Feedback shall be given to staff to ensure these are used on each occasion that a refusal or incident occurs at the premises.
- c) Any refusals made for alcohol service e.g. underage, will also be recorded (either in electronic or written form) and feedback given to staff as relevant. The log will be kept at the premises for a minimum of twenty four (24) months.

Refusals Book ⊺

The premises shall at all times maintain and operate an age-restricted sales refusals recording system (either in book or electronic form) which shall be reviewed by the Designated Premises Supervisor at intervals of no less than 4 weeks and feedback given to staff as relevant. This refusals book shall be available upon request to Sussex Police, officers of the local authority and officers from the Trading Standards team. The log will be kept at the premises for a minimum of twenty four (24) months.

Outside Areas

a) Customers will not be permitted to take alcohol or open vessels outside the premises to consume whilst smoking, congregating or eating on the pavement outside the premises.

SIA Numbers:

SIA registered door staff will operate at the premises as follows:

- a) Fridays and Saturdays (and additionally Sundays when there is a bank Holiday Monday the following day, Christmas Eve and New Years Eve); two door staff from 21:00hrs until the premises has closed to the public, licensable activity has ceased and the venue is completely clear of patrons.
- b) In addition, all events shall be risk assessed by the Designated Premises Supervisor and a minimum of two SIA registered door staff shall be on duty on any occasion where the risk assessment shows it to be necessary.
 - No persons under the age of 18yrs old to be within the premises after 2100hrs.

We talked a bit about the benefits of joining Eastbourne BCRP and the assistance you could get from both Sussex Police Licensing and Eastbourne Councils Licensing department. If your application is granted I hope you would consider taking advice from us all. In the meantime, please review the conditions above and let me know your acceptance or otherwise no later than 20th November 2019.

I write on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police for Sussex to raise a representation against the grant of the above application on the grounds that it will undermine the Licensing Objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and public safety.

This is a proposed licence variation in an area of Eastbourne which is subject to a Special Policy adopted by Eastbourne Borough Council (EBC). The premises lies within the Cumulative Impact Zone (as defined in the EBC statement of Licensing Policy 2019-2024) and seeks to amend the licence by removing a number of existing premises licence conditions and extending licensable activities and hours.

Paragraph 8.1 of Eastbourne Borough Councils statement of Licensing Policy 2019-2024 states; **The impact of the** number, type and density of licensed premises in a given area may lead to problems of noise, nuisance, crime and disorder outside of, or a distance from licensed premises. Cumulative Impact is defined as the "potential impact upon the Licensing Objectives of a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in an area," and is a proper matter for consideration by the Licensing Authority.

The current premises licence, under the name of Morey's, is suspended and has no Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) they had the following licensable activities;

- Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 2300-2330hrs
- Supply of Alcohol Monday to Friday 0800-2330hrs

The applicant describes the nature of proposed variation; live music, dancing, karaoke, films, indoor sporting events, boxing & wrestling entertainment and dancing performances. They also want to extend the "supply of alcohol" and late night refreshment to 0230hours.

The following conditions to be removed;

- Waiter service to persons seated at tables.
- Substantial food available at all times.

The applicant seeks the following licensable activities and timings;

- Films Monday Sunday 0800-0300
- Indoor Sporting events Monday to Sunday 2300-0300 (this has been crossed out, unsure if actually required)
- Boxing or wrestling Monday to Sunday 2300-0300 (this has been crossed out, unsure if actually required)
- Live music Monday to Sunday 2300-0300
- Recorded music Monday to Sunday 2300-0300
- Performances of dance Monday to Sunday 2300-0300
- Anything of a similar nature Monday to Sunday 2300-0300 "use of Karaoke machine amplified.
- Provisions of facilities for making music Monday to Sunday 2300-0300 (crossed out, nothing mentioned in brief description)
- Provisions of facilities for dancing Monday to Friday 2300-0300 (this has been crossed out, unsure if actually required)
- Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 2300-0230
- Supply of alcohol Monday to Sunday 2300-0230

Under the four Licensing Objectives, the applicant has copied the current licence conditions minus those applied to be removed. Nothing additional has been added or offered.

On review of the application it appears that the premises is looking to become a late night bar/club. This is evidenced by the requested removal of the restaurant condition therefore making them a vertical drinking establishment, the extended licensable hours and description of what licensable activities they would like to have.

Paragraph 14.24 of the Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018) provides:

"A cumulative impact assessment (CIA) may be published by a licensing authority to help it to limit the number or types of licence applications granted in areas where there is evidence to show that the number or density of licensed premises in the area is having a cumulative impact and leading to problems which are undermining the licensing objectives. CIAs relate to applications for new premises licences and club premises certificates and applications to vary existing premises licence and club premises certificates in a specified area."

Paragraph 14.40 of the Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018) provides:

'In publishing a CIA a licensing authority is setting down a strong statement of intent about its approach to considering applications for the grant or variation of premises licences or club premises certificates in the area described.... Applications in areas covered by a CIA should therefore give consideration to potential cumulative impact issues when setting out the steps that will be taken to promote the licensing objectives'

The applicant has not referred to the Cumulative Impact Policy or the EBC statement of Licensing in their application. They had not offered any additional conditions that would help mitigate any potential risk in a busy part of Eastbourne or provided any assurances of how the premises will promote the licensing objectives.

Sussex Police Licensing held a meeting with the applicant Mr Dene Sonnessa on 13th November 2019 at Bexhill Police Station. He was asked to clarify what type of premises he wanted to be as his application was not clear. He didn't really know but wanted the freedom within the licence to be able to try different things which is why he has asked for everything. He was advised that the application fell short of what was required. He explained he thought it would be straight forward as he was granted the current one without issue. It became clear he didn't understand the difference of licence he was applying for, have knowledge of the CIZ or had read the EBC statement of licensing. We spent an hour discussing things he should have been aware of but unfortunately wasn't.

Mr Sonnessa was emailed some conditions to consider being placed on his licence. He responded a day later than requested but was in agreement to the conditions. It is felt that as much as he has accepted the conditions, he had a further opportunity to detail himself how his premises would not have a negative impact on the night time economy which despite our meeting and having been handed the EBC statement of policy, failed to do so. We are therefore not confident that this premises will effectively promote the licensing objectives.

East Sussex Local Policing Support team Police Station, Terminus Road, Bexhill-on-Sea, East Sussex TN39 3NR The night time economy within Eastbourne can at times be very challenging for all the emergency services and the CIA has been shown to be a hot spot location within Eastbourne for crime and violent offences. There are already a high number of late night licensed venues all of which are in very close proximity to this new proposed venue and yet another late night vertical drinking establishment is likely to negatively add to the cumulative impact which in turn is likely to undermine the licensing objectives.

In light of the above together with recent data showing an increase in Sexual assault within the Cumulative area, Sussex Police are not satisfied that this application presents an exceptional case to override the presumption of rebuttal for new applications within the CIA. We invite the Licensing Authority to seriously consider refusing this application.

I would like to make a representation as a responsible authority, the current application does not meet the prevention of 'public nuisance' licensing objectives: I have concerns that the premises will add to the cumulative noise in the area and cause noise nuisance to residential properties in the area.

I request the following conditions to be added to the licence if/when granted.

1) A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Specialist Advisory Team, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Specialist Advisory Team and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Specialist Advisory Team. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Specialist Advisory Team. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.

2) No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

3) Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.

4) Doors leading into the premises should be kept closed apart from allowing ingress and egress after 23:00 hrs to avoid the escape of music/noise.

5) Customers outside the front of the premises should be monitored by staff and their numbers limited to 4 persons to ensure they do not cause any nuisance to residents.

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
