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### 1 Introduction

- 1.1 In its role as a provider of public scrutiny and as critical friend, the Policy and Performance Advisory Committee has a duty to provide a challenge to the executive decision and policy makers.
- 1.2 The Policy and Performance Advisory Committee is able to provide this challenge through the inclusion of the Cabinet's Forward Plan of Decisions as a standing item on each of the Committee's agendas, allowing the Committee to request the inclusion of reports due for consideration by the Cabinet on its agenda and by asking that the relevant officers, heads of service or directors, attend the Committee meetings and discuss the content of the reports.
- 1.3 Following consideration of each item, where the Members will be able to ask questions of the relevant officers, heads of service, directors and other stakeholders, the Policy and Performance Advisory Committee will provide one of the following three recommendations to the Cabinet:

  - (a) to implement the Scheme, such delegated authority to include any measures necessary for or incidental to its management and administration; and
  - (b) if necessary, and in accordance with paragraph 2.3, to amend the Scheme in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Assets and Finance
- (3) That the Exceptional Hardship Scheme continues in 2024/25 subject to funds being available.

The Council must review the scheme each year and adopt a scheme for the coming financial year.

Cabinet report: Council Tax Discounts and Premiums

Purpose of the report:

To determine the level of certain Council Tax discounts and Council Tax premiums with effect from 1 April 2024 and 1 April 2025

Officer recommendations to the Cabinet:

That Cabinet recommend to full Council the approval and implementation of the following:

- 1. From 1 April 2024
- (a) The adoption of a standard 0% discount for all Class D chargeable dwellings; and
- (b) Levying the maximum level of premium i.e.:
  - (a) Premium of 100% for dwellings which are unoccupied and substantially unfurnished (Empty Homes Premium) after 1 years up to 5 years of becoming empty;
  - (b) Premium of 200% for dwellings which are unoccupied and substantially unfurnished (Empty Homes Premium) between 5 years and up to 10 years; and
  - (c) Premium of 300% for dwellings which are unoccupied and substantially unfurnished (Empty Homes Premium) for 10 years or more.

# 2. From 1 April 2025

- (a) The continued application of 0% discount for Class D and Empty Homes premiums at 100% effective when dwellings have been unoccupied and substantially unfurnished for 1 year; and
- (b) The application of a premium (Second Homes Premium) of 100% for all dwellings that are no one's sole or main residence and which is substantially furnished.

## 3. Exception to premiums

Where premiums are to be applied, the Council is mindful of the current consultation by government which recommends exceptions in certain circumstances outlined within this report. Subject to the outcome of that consultation, it is recommended that the Section 151 Officer is given delegated powers to implement the Council's policy on premiums in line with statute, the Council's requirements and any guidance given by the Secretary of State.

# Reasons for recommendations:

- (a) To reduce the number of empty homes within the District in line with the Council's Empty Homes Strategy; and
- (b) To encourage the use of premises as main residences by local residents rather than second homes.
