Reasons for Decision:	The hearing concerned an application from Jazz Company UK Ltd for a premises licence at The Café, Princes Park for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises from Monday to Thursday inclusive from 11:00 to 20:00 hours and for Friday to Sunday inclusive from 11:00 to 22:00 hours. For New Years the licence to be 11:00 to 01:00 hours.						

	<p>In discharging its functions, the Sub-Committee considered the promotion of the four licensing objectives and in particular prevention of public nuisance and public safety, the Council's own Licensing Policy, the Home Office guidance, other relevant legislation and the rules of natural justice. The Sub-Committee considered the application and supporting documents from the applicant and their oral representation made at the hearing. One representation was received from a member of the public during the consultation process and the Sub-Committee gave due regard to the written and the oral representations of Mr Mike Ward.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee resolved to grant the application as applied for and as clarified.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee were satisfied with the application made and clarification given by the applicant's representation that the licensing objectives would be satisfied. It was noted that there were no representations given by responsible authorities.</p> <p>Whilst they noted the concerns of Mr Ward, the Sub-Committee took into account the applicant's explanations and steps they were proposing to take to address them.</p> <p>It was also noted that the previous licence had no significant concerns.</p>
